What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Lifestages Auto Option age 55 -64 has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the investment option with other investment options and funds. Funds Administration New Zealand Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this investment option

This life cycle investment stage invests 40% in the Lifestages High Growth Fund and 60% in the Lifestages Income Fund, which is regarded as providing appropriate levels of risk and return for a person aged 55-64.***

What are the risks of investing?



Example of how this applies to an investor


Hayley had \$10,000 in the investment option at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Hayley received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$238 (that is 2.38% of her initial \$10,000). Hayley also paid \$24.00 in other charges. This gives Hayley a total return after tax of \$106.00 for the year.

Currency hedging

As at 30 June 2020 the fund has an exposure to foreign currency assets of 68.52%, of which 47.06% was hedged back to NZD. This means the fund's foreign currency exposure is 21.46%. Notes

- ¹ As the investment option has not been in existence for 5 years, a combination of actual returns and market index returns have been used to calculate the investment option's risk indicator. Market index returns and benchmark weightings have been used up to October 2015 when the investment option commenced. The risk indicator may therefore provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of the investment option.
- ² Note that market indices reflect no deduction for charges and tax.
- ³ This covers expenses incurred in running the fund (e.g. accounting, audit, and regulatory compliance costs). This also covers the Supervisor's annual fee (for the services it provides) and an estimate of fees and expenses incurred by the underlying funds. GST will be included in some expenses, where applicable. Our estimates are made on the basis of reasonable assumptions about the ongoing level of fees and costs expected to be charged (taking into account the actual fees and costs as a percentage of average net asset value that were charged for the most recent scheme year). These fees are deducted from, and reflected in the unit price of the fund.
- 4 The investment option invests 40% in the Lifestages High Growth Fund and 60% in the Lifestages Income Fund. The actual investment mix, target investment mix, top 10 investments and currency hedging all reflect the assets invested proportionally in these Lifestages Funds.
- ** The investment option changed its name to Lifestages Auto Option age 55-64 in the PDS dated 13 April 2018 due to the introduction of the Lifestages Auto Option 65+ life cycle investment stage.
- *** The asset allocation of this investment option, and thus the fund description, changed in April 2018.
